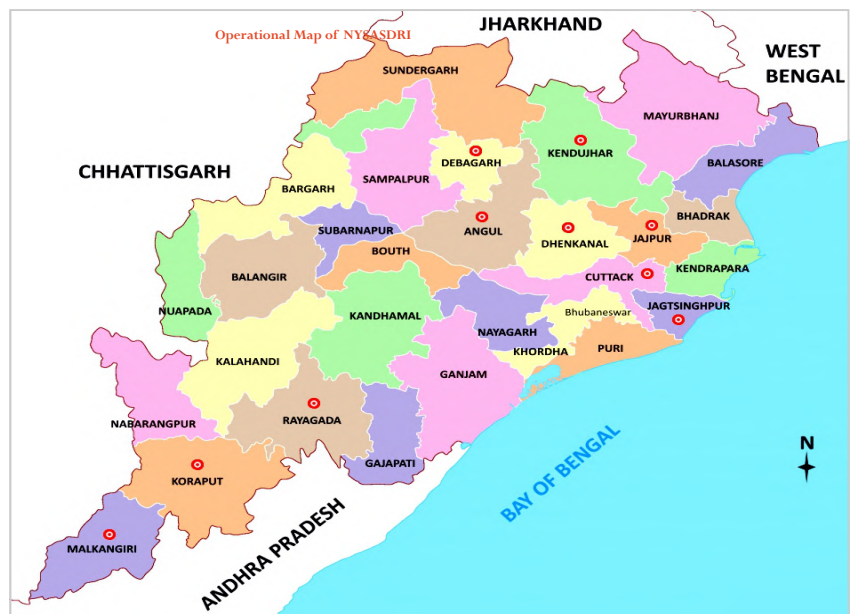

The target groups are marginalized people from scheduled tribes and scheduled castes, destitute women, children, people with disabilities, disaster victims, forest dwellers, and people needing eye care and general health care, and other underprivileged groups.

Rehabilitation Services (Swadhar Greh for women and girls in distress)



For the rehabilitation of women in difficult circumstances, NYSASDRI implements Swadhar Greh that provides shelter to women for a period their rehabilitation. This shelter home has a capacity for 30 women and 7 children.

65 women and 30 children have been newly enrolled during the year 2021-22 and added with existing 27 women and 13 children. . 63 women and 30 children have been rehabilitated in their families & relatives/ in-laws house. A total of 92 residents had been given treatment for health checkup. The Swadhar Greh provides opportunities to women for learning income generating vocational activities like tailoring, broom making, bamboo crafts, kitchen garden,

nursery and mushroom cultivation etc. The residents were extended with facilities of accommodation, food, clothes, and sundry daily items. Counseling, legal aid, entertainment, recreation and healthcare check-ups are also taken care. Total 6 children continued their schooling in the local Anganwadi Centre and primary school. Under the chairpersonship of Child Development Project Officer, Gondia, a Committee of Swadhar Greh has been formed. The committee reviews the quality of food and other provisions to the satisfaction of the residents. Quality of counseling given on quarterly basis and recommendations are given for further improvements.

Four committee meetings were organized during the year. Swadhar Greh celebrated festivals and observed national days with immense of joy and happiness, Koushalya Bhoi (a resident of Swadhar greh) W/o Chandan Bhoi, At/-Baniapada, Po/Ps-Gondia, Dist-Dhenkanal is aged about 33yrs old got married to Chandan Bhoi 11 yrs ago. He is a daily labourer, belonging to poor family. But due to male infertility problem both husband & wife faced lots of criticism and mental harassment of Society. Under medical treatment they tried to conceiving baby, but due to alcoholic nature, he always beats to her wife .Then she depressed and certainly left her home & complaint a case against her husband in nearest police station, Gondia. Then after go through her situation police refereed to NYSASDRI Swadhar Greh on 7/02/2021 for her better

accommodation and reconciliation of her problem. After counselling she was living in Swadhar Greh and actively participated Kitchen garden, vocational training. After several time counselling to both (couple) are not agree for reconciliation. But after few months many efforts made by Swadhar Greh staffs, and finally on 13.10.2021 organized a session meeting with Chandan Bhoi, their village head, family members and relatives under the guidance by guidance of Gondia police for their mutual Settlement. In this meeting we consider on both parties lots of opinion and arguments, and counselled to both parties, both understand their mistake and in the knowledge of police we successfully rehabilitated to Koushalya Bhoi in her In-law's house .Now both are maintain their conjugal life very happily.

Family Counseling Centre

The Family Counselling Centre (FCC) of NYSASDRI has extended services to 129 families out of 132 cases enrolled during the reporting year through counselling in joint and individual sessions. Counsellors make counselling sessions and organize sessions where there is active participation from the local police, Panchayat Raj Institution members, District Social Welfare officer, Protection officer and advocate that have authority to reconcile grievances community members may have with authorities in the region. In response to their specific need, some families may be referred to legal aid cells, police stations, Swadhar Greh, Ujjawala and the women's cell opened by the government at the district. Four sub-committee meetings have been conducted to support community members with complaints. The sub-committees also conduct reviews of current programs affecting the community and approve future plans of action.

The family counselling centre has been conducting 22 nos publicity and awareness campaigns on different social issues in the community about better self-control and reducing violence towards women during the third wave Covid 19 and stay at home situation .

This case study is related to about 27 years old woman Manini Naik, blessed with 2 children, who has been facing the problems of Family dispute since the last 4 years as well as physically and mentally

tortured by her husband after marriage. She belongs to poor family and her occupation is house wife. Her husband has left her along with 2 children, without any support. Though she is under metric, she is unable to earn money for survival and rise up of her children. She is afraid of staying with her husband because of his intoxicant addiction with alcoholism and murderous. Wherefore she is struggling to rise up her two children. .Hence she filed a case on date 03/03/2022 in Family Counselling Centre, DSWO, Dhenkanal. After understanding of her problem, the counsellor issued a notice to both the parties for counselling and solved out the problem of the case. Both the parties were presented in Family Counselling Centre and conducted the session meeting for a long period and they put forward their views in the FCC. Keeping in views of the above situation the staff members of the Family Counselling Centre along with both the parties had a long period of discussion for mutual understanding among themselves. Henceforth, the counsellor provided proper counselling for a long period to make them understand each one's importance and values. At the end of the session meeting both the parties agreed for the mutual settlement of the case. Srikant Naik promised to bear all the expenses of Manini Naik and his children. He will be responsible for all the family matters, necessity and look after his family members. Now both of them are living together with two children with peacefully and happily.



Deemed Orphan

During the financial year 2021-2022, a total 30 Children were enrolled with previous 13 children and 30 children got discharged from the home. Special care was rendered to children in the Swadhar Greh. Necessary support for education along with recreation, additional food supplement, health check-up and medicine for ill children have been provided. Playing materials like Indoor game of carom, Ludo, Chinese checker etc was supplied to them. New clothes on special occasion were bought for them. Major festivals and national days were observed inside the home campus. We are observing by celebrating the festivals, National days and birthdays of children throughout the year.



NYSASDRI Educational Complex



NYSASDRI runs an educational complex at Hukumtola in the Rayagada district of Odisha. Currently, 120 tribal girls are being provided with primary education up to class 5. They have provision for accommodation food, uniform dress materials, sundry and toiletry items, learning materials, and pocket money, excursions like picnics, and healthcare check-ups and necessary medications. But due to Covid-19 pandemic situation the school teachers are teaching children at their door steps as physical class at school was restricted by government. In the other hand Virtual class was not possible due lack of devices in assessable area. Regular counselling to students and their parents is going on, for continuation of education. Supply dress materials, teaching materials like books, note sheet, pen, pencil,

and other education materials as many students are living with economic crisis due to pandemic situation. Organised parent's teachers meeting share with them about continuation of children's guide their children. As per Government of Odisha notification the school was reopen on 14th Feb 2022 with Covid -19 guideline. So our teaching and non teaching staffs cleaning the campus and necessary arrangement for reopen of the school. Presently 120 students are available classroom teaching in the school.

On 13th December 2021 NYSASDRI Education Complex for Tribal girls was inspected by Additional District welfare officer, Gunupur, District Social Security Officer, Rayagada and District Education Officer, Rayagada.

NYSASDRI School of Journalism and Social work (NSJS)

As we know that the pandemic situation became vilest for which all educational institutions were notified to remain close for physical classes. Hence, looking towards the welfare of students and their career, permission given for the virtual class and this platform includes making attendance, attending classes, connecting on video conferences, joining Zoom classrooms. The 4th semester examination of 2019-21 held on the month of September, 2021 on online mode and 47 student's pass out in MSW & MAJMC courses. For the 2021-23 sessions 69 students had taken admission in both MSW and MAJMC course. Out of 47 Students from 2019-21

batches, 42 Students have placed in different NGOs and corporate sectors. Students of MSW 2nd semester conduct their field work on dated. 20th Jan to 24th Jan, 2022 in nearby villages like Kusupada, Godisahi and Kanteikolia. On 07th March, 2022 the second year students of MSW and MAJMC greeted the fresher's of 2021-23 batches. On 11th March-2022, principal conference meeting was organised by Utkal University of Culture and our principal was participated in the meeting.



School Partnership Programme

Under this programme The British Public School (NYSASDRI School), Kashipur, SEED Kanyashram(Tandapally) and NYSASDRI School (Hukumtola) partnership programme is going on. Due to Covid Pandemic situation, yet the school was not opened, our teachers rendered education through virtual classes, but those students are not able to attend virtual classes due to network issues. Hence, teachers are visiting their home on a rotation basis and guiding them. Creating awareness on Covid-19 and sharing information to children,

their parents regarding mandatory wearing of masks, physical distancing, provision of thermal scanning and regular hand washing with soap or sanitizer etc. Furthermore, campus development activities, such as: vegetable cultivation and flower plant planted in the garden undertaken. Renovated broken boundary wall, colouring of furniture, playing equipment, hostel building front part, changing of roof of cottage, newly constructed ramps beautification and regular cleanness of the school campus etc.



Meikrich Model is new experiment in community health

During this reporting year our main focus concentrate to community on Covid -19 3rd wave pandemic and support service to community people .Regularly NYSASDRI staffs rendering services like distributed mask, sanitizer, and motivated to people for maintain social distance As the Meikirch model is explained about the demand of life, the biologically given potential and the personally acquired potential. So we focused on five major

components under Meikirch model approaches such as Demands of life, biologically given potential, and personally acquired potential, social determinants of health and environmental determinants of health. In this context people are taking a lot of preventive mechanisms to escape the pandemic situation. After analysis of the situation we learn that Meikirch model approaches are also very helpful to prevent

Self help support for differently able persons

During this reporting year our main focus concentrate to community on Covid -19 3rd wave pandemic and support service to community people .Regularly NYSASDRI staffs rendering services like distributed mask, sanitizer, and motivated to people for maintain social distance As the Meikirch model is explained about the demand of life, the biologically given potential and the personally acquired potential. So we focused on five major As far as we know that the whole country is plagued by the Corona epidemic. Under such circumstances, when the general public is facing a lot of difficulties, the problems of people with

disabilities are very high. The self help program is helping persons differentially able in financial assistance, counselling, vocational training, and group efforts etc to them through this group.



They were also warned to be vigilant about the Corona epidemic and always take safety measures like use of masks, maintain social distance, regularly wash hands with hand wash, use of sanitizers, and not to go outside home without any cause etc. During stay at home we have supported financially to 60 disable persons for manage during the crisis period. Also supported self help support to 20 new persons with disability in Gondia block of Dhenkanal .

52 year old Abhiram Behera hails from Schedule tribe community of Mathatentulia village in Odisha. He is not educated enough, differently abled, still he is the only earning person in the family and Five lives are dependent on Abhi. Being for his physical condition, he is getting disable pension, rice through ration card, a small house and a

tricycle. His earning was very limited through his small petty shop; he gradually felt that things will get harder & difficult in future time, so he applied for a support, expanded his business. Now he is getting a profit of more than Rs 300 a day and became a trend setter for others in the locality.



Campaiging and special care during COVID-19 Pandemic

Staffs are engaged in community sensitisation work, regularly informed to community about maintaining social distance hand washing and avail vaccination These are also in practise at our Hospital, Swadhar Greh , family counselling centre and NYSASDRI School of Journalism and Social Work among staffs . NYSASDRI supplied hygienic materials such as soap and masks to 200 students 500 people in the community and PPE for our own doctors and health workers. Counselling services also provided to persons living with panic condition and domestic violence cases .NYSASDRI has an ophthalmic

institute and in our battle against COVID-19, our frontline health workers such as doctors, nurses and other groups have played a pivotal role and providing emergency ophthalmic services to the people are in need. The staff at Hospital not only treat the patients, they are also providing face masks to every visitor to the hospital, so as sensitising the patients, attendants about the social distancing, hygienic measures to be taken during this outbreak. All are feared and fighting for survival against COVID-19virus.

Restoration of Degraded Forests and Livelihood Improvement of Forest Dependent Communities (OFSDP-II)

In Forestry Sector Development, “NYSASDRI” has been playing a powering role since beginning of the organisation for protection of Forest and Wildlife through community forest management concept. The organisation showed interest to join hands

with Odisha Forestry Sector Development Project (FSDP-II) because of the Organisation’s mandates matched with project objectives for ensuring JFM. “NYSASDRI” being the partner NGO in Dhenkanal Forest Division working since 2017.

The Organisation has deployed 18 personnel in 06 teams to work in six FMUs (Dhenkanal, Hindol, Kamashya Nagar East, Kamakshya Nagar West, Sadangi and Kapilash) adopted under Dhenkanal Forest Division. Each PNGO team consists of one Team Leader from Institutional Building and two Development Officers including of a lady officer by default from community development background. They all have stationed at their respective FMU HQs and operate from the FMU Office functioning under Department. The staffs are engaged the following activities in 06 forest management unit and coverage 150 Vana Surakshya Samiti 1220 women self help groups. NYSASDRI is involved in undertaking of activities of Selection of target Villages/Reformation of Vanasurakshya Samits (VSSs), Engagement of VSS Animators, Survey, Demarcation & Pillar Posting, Micro Plan Preparation, Capacity Building Training Programme, Extension of Farm Forestry activities along with Sustainable Forest Management, Livelihood Improvement programmes. Awareness on forest fire, Nursery raising and plantation and forest protection are also taken care by NYSASDRI towards community mobilisation for their involvement in Forest management and protection. During the Year 2021-22 under such project, the focus was given for training of SHG/VSS members for undertaking of different Income Generation Activities through Revolving fund support

made under the Project. 150 VSS have been assisted under such revolving fund support of Rs2.00 to each VSS for promotion of IGAs in their Villages.

Ratnapur VSS is one of the project VSS under OFSDP-II of Kamakshyanagar west FMU, Dhenkanal Forest Division. In this village people are mostly depends on agriculture for their livelihood. But due to erratic monsoon the crop production of the village are not up to mark. So the youth of the village migrated in neighboring state in search of income. After COVID-19



Pandemic, They came back to their native place and sat idle. After OFSDP intervention in the village/VSS the 18 no's of young farmers are identified. All of them given rupees 1000/- as COVID-19 assistance from horticulture department through convergence by virtue of which they start their mushroom cultivation individually with 15 no's of beds, with technical support of AHO Parjang. Further they expanded their bed nos and these people are doing mushroom cultivation till now. Now a days these youth are not going outside of the State for earning.



Livelihood Improvement through Vermi compost Production

Odisha Forestry Sector Development Project -II runs under Forest & Environment Dept. Govt. Of Odisha has Implemented in different Division among of them Dhenkanal division Implemented the project to Restoration of Degraded Forest , Sustainable Forest Management and Livelihood improvement of Forest fringe dwellers ,through initiative like Afforestation.

In Dhenkanal forest Division there are 6 nos. of Field Management Unit established to implement the project in VSS level. Nathua Puruna Sahi VSS situated in Sagarposhi Grama Panchayat of Sadar Block in Dhenkanal District under Sadangi FMU in Dhenkanal DMU. The VSS is consisting of 107 house hold having heterogeneous community. It is about 12 km distance from National highway & 16 km distance from district head office. Due to villagers keen interest this village got registered as a VSS in the name of Maa Andhari Bauti VSS and also VSS formed in the year 2019-20 under Sadangi FMU in OFSDP-II project. As per discussion of VSS members about their livelihood status that's we find all the villagers mostly depend upon agriculture for their livelihood. The villagers has got

opportunity to start the VSS under OFSDP -II project in the year 2019-20. All the VSS members keep good relationship with Forest dept.. FMU staffs & P- NGO representatives'-NGO team (NYSASDRI) initiated to take a convergence with Gramin Product Marketing (GPM) for improvement of livelihood in the process of Vermi Compost Pit. Now 85 nos of beneficiaries benefited and improve their livelihood by doing of Vermi Compost Pit. First time 17 nos of beneficiaries implemented this unit doing the investment of 3000. After Six month every beneficiaries selling their vermi Compost to some VSS areas of Kamakshyanagar & Bhuban @ the rate 20/- with the support of DMU Dhenkanal. The Forest Department has made a buyback guaranty with the villagers to purchase the vermi composts which they sold 198 qntrs of vermicompost to Department @ the cost of Rs 3.76 Lacs. Every beneficiaries are highly benefited from this business. 90 nos of SHG Leaders of Keonjhar Division made their exposure visit to this VSS in the month of March-22. Now the VSS members of Maa Andhari Bauti VSS- Nathuapuruna sahi were very happy for developing their income level and they have thanks to P-NGO team members for develop our income level with the convergence of line dept.





Comprehensive Eye Care Services

Ensuring quality at every stage of eye care delivery has always been a priority at Kalinga Eye Hospital ever since its inception. In recent years, there is an increasing trend of hospitals applying for NABH quality accreditation. Considering this as an opportunity to enhance the quality and efficiency of care delivery, Kalinga Eye Hospital also applied for NABH accreditation.

The lockdown and the associated restrictions posed a great challenge for outreach activities for all hospitals. Even Kalinga Eye Hospital was only able to conduct 176 free eye camps during the year, which is about 50% of its usual annual performance. Vision centres, though they remained closed for many months during lockdown and physical distancing matter. Hence in the entire year, Kalinga Eye Hospital has able to help only 5663 needy & deserving people directly

through surgical interventions and in these sight restoration activities. Eye camp approach has been adopted to tackle the huge burden of cataract blindness in those with leprosy. In the initial phase, two eye camps were conducted in Dhenkanal, Angul & Deogarh districts. 266 people were screened during the camps from which 149 were provided with ophthalmic medicines, 64 were provided with refractive corrected spectacles and 65 were diagnosed with cataract. On September 24 (Friday), 2021, Mr. Nakamura Ken, Acting Consul General of Japan in Kolkata, along with the representatives of the recipient organization, NYSASDRI “The Project for Universal Eye Health for Underprivileged Children in Odisha” via a virtual conference. Under the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Project (GGP) Scheme.

Professional training course:



Skills, knowledge, and innovation are important driving forces of economic growth and social

development in our nation. To further strengthen our nation, Kalinga Eye Hospital prioritizes education. Vocational (or skill-based) education is becoming increasingly important today, with many employers expecting new employees to have all of the practical skills that they need to start work. Vocational education is similarly critical for those who have to support their families immediately after senior secondary school.

Kalinga Eye Hospital got affiliated with National Council of Vocational and Research Training and run one year diploma in ophthalmic assistant course. This year total 11 no of students enrolled and taking both theory and practical classes as per guideline of NCVRT.

From the 2022-23 onwards Kalinga Eye Hospital going to organise 4 yrs Bachelor in Optometry and 2yrs diploma in Optometry course in its own hospital premises .

Global Network for Disaster Risk Reduction:

As a partner of Global Network for Disaster Risk Reduction We have involved in Views from the Frontline 2019 activities and establishes a local baseline and local monitoring process to measure progress towards achieving an inclusive “people-centred” approach to

resilience-building, as promoted within the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR) and other frameworks part of the Agenda 2030. In doing so, NYSASDRI to increase awareness and strengthen accountability of governments and intergovernmental bodies for a people-centred.

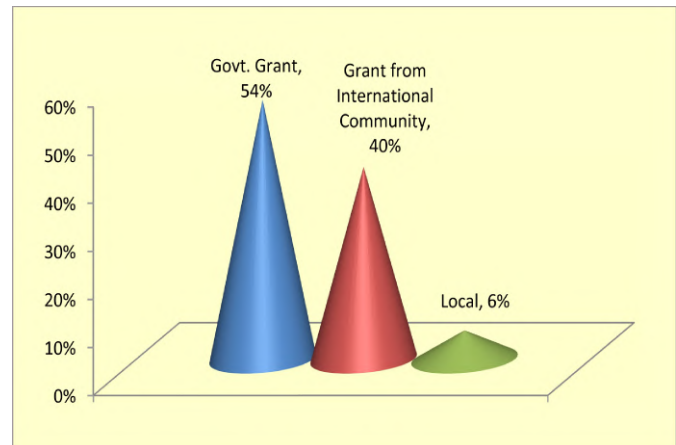
