Due to this corona virus they faced more difficulties to manage their own family members, due to this situation Anita Biswal was physically and mentally torture by her husband and sister in-law in their house. Because she is a mental problem and fits patient therefore her husband could not accepted to her after knowing her problem, and the family disturbances started from that period and she was tortured by her husband as well as sister in-law every day. As soon as possible she decided to go parent's house and after1yr she gave call to Family counselling centre to file a case. But soon after the call was stopped Pratap Biswal came to the Family counselling centre to file a case about their problem for counselling and settlement

Deployed two new team (Batch-III) in OFSDP-II FMUs Kamakshyanagar

After the successful work in other FMUs, the DMU Chief Dhenkanal has signed MoUs with the P-NGO, NYSASDRI to conduct programmes at FMU Kamakshyanagar East & West. The MoU was signed on 1st October 2020 and accordingly two team consisting of one team leader, one Development officer on NRM and one Development Officer for CD &LLI for each FMU were sent to each FMUs. After orientation both the team working at FMU Kamakshyanagar West and East from 1st October 2020.

OFSDP-II SADAR: Livestock rearing is an important economic activity in the rural area of the farmers economic. It provides supplementary income to the most of the families depending on agriculture, forest and many landless families. Apart from providing a subsidiary income, livestock is also a source of protein in the form of milk, egg and meat. Hence to improve the socio-economic condition of Madhapur Karadasingh Vana Surakha Samiti, with the support of Odapada Block Veterinary dept, NYSASDRI organized animal vaccination camp on 28.09.2020 for domestic animals to prevent viral fever. Total 32 households and 223 animals (Cattle 71, Goat 112 and Sheep 40) benefited in this Vaccination Camp. During winter we are planning to cover vaccination camp in other VSSs.









A Case Study on Drainage Line Treatment in Sinkol VSS Forest Assigned Area

The mission of Odisha Forestry Sector Development project-II is restoration of degraded forests through sustainable forest management and alleviating poverty through Livelihood improvement of Forest Fringe dwellers. As a part of sustainable forest management the drainage line treatment in different nala's implemented in Sinkol VSS forest assigned area under Field Management unit, Hindol. VSS forest assigned with certain part of Kandhara R.F covers 195.3 Ha which bears 6 measure Nala's, along with them 3 Nala's treated with 10 nos, of Loose Boulder



Check Dam with assistance of Rs 1,18,000 which has created 395 man days in 2 ha area, tends to lead livelihood improvement of VSS people. After treatment of Nala's from ridge to vally it seems reduce of soil erosion and curtail water velocity, as a result regeneration of plants along
