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1. Executive Summary:

The sewing machine operator training project under the CSR initiative aimed to empower economically disadvantaged and unemployed women in Odisha. Through collaboration between ESSEL Mining & Industries Limited, NYSASDRI, World Skill Centre, and Abbey West Services Pvt. Ltd., 350 women were trained over a period of three months. The project successfully achieved its goal of enhancing the capacities of women through skill-based training, enabling them to secure jobs and break the chains of poverty.

2. Introduction:

In earnest discussions on women's empowerment, gender equality, equal opportunity, and dignity for women, the invaluable contribution of NGOs in India cannot be overstated. NGOs have tirelessly reached every corner to raise awareness among women and society at large regarding the pivotal role and contributions of women in national and societal development, a facet long overlooked. This recognition owes much to the policies, plans, and programs of various international, national, and resource agencies aimed at fostering the educational, skill development, and capacity-building of women, culminating in a significant transformation in the status of women and empowering them to become self-reliant leaders in socio-economic development.

The current landscape depicts a noteworthy shift in women's participation in education, employment, village meetings, and democratic decision-making bodies compared to three decades ago. There is a heightened level of awareness among women regarding their involvement in education, employment, and the development process. However, this energy must be complemented by the requisite skills demanded by the service sector. In this context, NYSASDRI, as a development organization, has played a pivotal role in equipping rural women with the necessary skills to attain economic self-sufficiency, thereby serving as a beacon of inspiration for others.

In rural and semi-urban areas, a significant number of girls and women, though not highly educated, have completed education up to a certain level. Their limited education is often attributed to socio-economic and cultural constraints. Regrettably, these individuals are neither eligible for lucrative employment nor inclined to work as wage laborers. They harbour aspirations to contribute meaningfully to society, yet their level of education and skills hinder their ability to earn a dignified livelihood, leaving them with a sense of emptiness. Here, NYSASDRI acts as a catalyst by providing opportunities to deserving individuals. Through targeted skill-building training, coupled with motivation and counselling

for both the girls and their parents, NYSASDRI prepares them mentally and physically to embark on a journey toward building their careers.

3. Program Overview:

At the heart of our initiative is the commitment to unlocking doors to employment opportunities and entrepreneurial triumphs. These skill-based programs act as vital catalysts, enabling marginalized individuals to establish businesses or secure jobs, thereby breaking the chains of poverty. Focused on introducing new skills, such as tailoring, to rural women,

We aim to foster self-reliance in villages. The ultimate goal is to equip economically disadvantaged and unemployed women, especially from vulnerable sections, with the tools for self-sufficiency. Special emphasis is placed on empowering women by instilling confidence and independence through essential employment skills, enhancing overall livelihoods.

The initial project phase aims to empower a minimum of 350 women in rural areas across diverse locations, with insights gained informing future enhancements to amplify the impact of skill development initiatives.

To transform this mission into reality, ESSEL mining & industries limited and NYSASDRI had joined their hands together on the month of March 2023 to give residential training to the girls of Odisha on sewing machine operator trade followed by placement in industries for their livelihood.

4. About the Partners:

Essel Mining & Industries Limited: Established in 1950, Essel Mining & Industries Limited is a stalwart in India's iron ore mining sector and a producer of noble Ferro Alloys within the Aditya Birla Group. Committed to Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), Essel contributes to the social and economic empowerment of stakeholders, especially vulnerable communities. It focuses on jobs, skilling, and resources initiatives aims to elevate communities and improve India's Human Development Index

(HDI). This skilling program was financially supported by Essel Mining & Industries Ltd as a commitment to their Corporate Social Responsibility.

World Skill Centre (WSC): A premier advanced skill training institute established by the Government of Odisha, WSC, through the Odisha Skill Development Authority (OSDA), imparts advanced skill training on eight trades from engineering to service sectors. Catering primarily to talents from ITIs and Polytechnics, WSC transforms individuals into globally employable professionals. In this program, WSC assisted Essel Mining & Industries Limited in identifying the appropriate program execution partner and at the same time provided useful support in terms of teaching materials, training modules, content and designing. During the training, WSC also provided all kinds of guidance for successful operation.

NYSASDRI: Registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860, NYSASDRI is a non-profit organization based in Odisha, India working since 4 decades for the development of marginalized sections in society. During this tenure NYSASDRI successfully implemented various skilled based training to youth for their placement and self employment. NYSASDRI always focuses on economic development as well as social development through skill training. Registered with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India, for CSR activities, NYSASDRI's role in this program was to provide training to women on sewing machine operator. NYSASDRI was the legal holder as well as implementer of this project. (Profile of NYSASDRI is attached in Annex. -1)

Abbey West Services Pvt. Ltd.: Founded in 2010, Abbey West Services Pvt. Ltd. envisions providing world-class skill development training programs with industry and government support. Addressing contemporary challenges of unemployment, Abbey West focuses on contributing to education and skilling through a value system. As the technical partner in this program, Abbey West Services Pvt. Ltd. plays a crucial role in identifying and mobilizing needy and deserving students, providing logistic and technical support for organising the training and utilising its well designed and well set-up placement cell for the placement of the trainees. (Profile of Abbey West Services Pvt. Ltd. is attached in Annex.-2)

5. Project Objectives:

The primary objective of the project was to empower economically disadvantaged and unemployed women, particularly from vulnerable sections of Odisha State, through sewing machine operator training. The aim was to enhance their capacities, enable self-reliance, and facilitate their participation in socio-economic development.

6. Project Deliverables:

- Sewing Machine Operator Training Curriculum
- Training Centres in Bhubaneswar and Baripada
- Training Materials and Equipment
- Placement Opportunities for Trainees

7. Project Timeline:

- February 10, 2023: Memorandum of Understanding signed between ESSEL Mining & Industries and NYSASDRI
- March 20, 2023: First instalment of the grant received
- December 13, 2023: Third instalment of the grant received
- March 30, 2024: Completion of the last training batch

8. Project Scope:

The project aimed to train 350 women as sewing machine operators over a period of three months. Training was conducted in residential mode, with a focus on empowering women from rural and semi-urban areas of Odisha.

9. Project Methodology:

The project utilized a collaborative approach involving ESSEL Mining & Industries Limited, NYSASDRI, World Skill Centre, and Abbey West Services Pvt. Ltd. Mobilization teams identified and counselled eligible candidates, who underwent aptitude tests before being selected for training. The curriculum was designed in alignment with the syllabus developed by the Odisha Skill Development Authority.

Training Progress:

By the end of July 2023, three batches had completed their training at our Bhubaneswar campus, with the fourth batch finishing in December 2023. To meet the remaining training targets by March 2024, we focused on mobilizing candidates from Mayurbhanj district, the largest and most promising area. Recognizing the need for additional training capacity, we established two training centres in Baripada.

10. Project Budget and Resources:

- Total budget allocated: Rs. 2,10,56,000.00
- Unit cost per trainee: Rs. 60,160.00

- Received four instalments of the grant from February 10, 2023, to March 18, 2024.

11. Key Achievements:

- Training of 350 women as sewing machine operators
- Collaboration between multiple stakeholders
- Successful mobilization and selection of candidates
- Establishment of training centers in Bhubaneswar and Baripada
- Placement of trainees in various industries

The Intervention Sequences:

- Signed memorandum of understanding between Essel Mining & Industries and NYSASDRI on February 10, 2023.
- Allocation of funds amounting to Rs. 2,10,56,000.00 on February 10, 2023.
- Unit cost per trainee: Rs. 60,160.00.
- Received the first instalment of the grant on March 20, 2023.
- Received the second instalment of the grant on September 19, 2023.
- Received the third instalment of the grant on December 13, 2023.
- Received the fourth instalment of the grant on March 18, 2024.
- Project commenced with the publication of the training course and dissemination of information to deserving candidates.
- Mobilization and counselling camps conducted at the block and district levels for candidate selection.
- Shortlisting of candidates for training.
- Aptitude tests conducted and confirmation of trainees' interest.
- Second round of counselling for trainees.
- Organization of batch-wise training programs (35 trainees per batch, totalling 10 batches).
- Three batches conducted at the Bhubaneswar training centre.
- Seven batches conducted across two training centres in Baripada to meet the target within the stipulated timeframe.
- Performance testing of trainees and certification.
- Placement and follow-ups.

12. Mobilization:

A mobilization team comprising 10 members, each with extensive experience in community outreach, was assembled. Following an orientation on their roles and responsibilities, the team was tasked with initiating the project. Actively engaging with rural villages across various districts in the state, the project team identified economically disadvantaged women from marginalized communities. Through targeted counselling, these women were guided towards opportunities for skill enhancement and livelihood improvement. Following mobilization efforts, candidates underwent an aptitude test, with final selection based on performance and expressed interest in acquiring skills to support their

families. The selected individuals were then brought to the training centres in Bhubaneswar/Baripada, with the objective of empowering them to rebuild their careers through skill development.

Trainees' Benefits:

During the training period, the safety and well-being of our trainees were of utmost importance. We ensured that comprehensive safety measures were in place, including the availability of a first-aid kit to address any health emergencies that may arise. Our aim was to create a comfortable and nurturing environment where trainees felt at home and could engage in effective teaching and learning.

In addition to the above considerations, we provided the following benefits and facilities to each trainee throughout the duration of the training course:

- Food and accommodation
- Uniform attire
- Training materials
- Grooming kit
- Travel expenses (from home to the training centre and from the training centre to the placement location)

Counselling:

Before the commencement of training, an additional round of counselling was organized with the following objectives:

- Ensuring smooth execution of the training program,
- Establishing a common understanding among trainees regarding the rules, regulations, and principles to be adhered to during training,
- Instilling discipline among trainees,
- Emphasizing punctuality,
- Fostering cooperation and knowledge sharing among trainees to achieve equal levels of understanding,
- Arranging extra classes if required by any participant.

Training Offered:

The training adhered to the syllabus and content developed by the Odisha Skill Development Authority (OSDA). Experts from OSDA and Abbey West Services Pvt. Ltd. provided guidance and expertise in training the candidates. In addition to technical skills in sewing machine operation, the candidates also received training in soft skills such as spoken English and basic computer knowledge, imparted by certified trainers. Incorporating these soft skills into the curriculum was deemed necessary to meet contemporary demands, as proficiency in language and electronic

communication are fundamental in various workplace settings. Equipped with these three skills, candidates can seamlessly integrate into any job environment upon selection.

Trainees underwent regular exams (conducted fortnightly) to assess their learning progress and growth, allowing for tailored plans to improve performance. In addition to traditional classroom sessions, innovative audio-visual tools and methodologies were employed to enhance engagement and comprehension. Industry experts and faculty were invited to provide insights into real-world requirements and work environments. Industrial site visits were also organized to offer practical exposure to trainees.

Upon completion of training, all 350 candidates underwent final assessments conducted by an external third-party assessment agency, receiving certificates upon successful completion.

Extracurricular Activities:

Weekly activity classes were conducted on Saturdays, offering candidates opportunities to learn in a fun and participative manner. Team-building, communication, and leadership exercises were encouraged, with regular participation in outdoor games. Local festivals were celebrated at the center, providing candidates with a sense of home and community.

Placement:

Our placement cell continuously monitors the HR needs and requirements of interested companies. Upon completion of training and assessment, candidates pursue placement opportunities at companies such as Aditya Birla Fashion Retail in Bangalore and others with whom we maintain ongoing relationships. After candidates are placed, we monitor their retention and address any work-related issues through counselling and appropriate measures as needed. Some sectors where our candidates have been successfully placed include:

Training Impact Assessment:

We have conducted periodic impact assessments of our training programs, revealing both economic and social advancements among the candidates. Many have secured positions that not only offer economic stability but have also bolstered their self-confidence and social standing. For most, the training has illuminated a clear career path.

We established two milestones:

1. Retention of trainees for a minimum of 6 months post-training.
2. Retention of trainees for at least 12 months with an accompanying salary increase.

We have achieved the first milestone in 70% of cases, while the second milestone has been reached in 45% of cases. Trainees express deep gratitude to ESSEL Mining & Industries Limited for providing them with the means to soar in life, believing they've found a solid foundation to further their careers.

13. Challenges and Issues:

- Delays due to heatwave during the mobilization phase
- Discrepancy in projected timeline for shortlisting candidates
- Strategic shift to focus on specific districts due to overwhelming demand

Program Realignment Due to Circumstances:

During the planning phase, there was a discrepancy between our projected timeline for shortlisting trainees and the actual time spent due to unforeseen challenges. The heatwave and rising temperatures significantly hampered the mobility of our team, resulting in delays. Moreover, while our initial plan aimed to cover multiple districts, the overwhelming demand for training in Khurda and Mayurbhanj compelled us to refocus our efforts on these two districts. Recognizing the impact and outcomes of training in these areas, we decided to prioritize them for the current phase, with plans for expansion to other districts in the future. This strategic shift not only facilitates better monitoring and follow-up but also ensures that deserving candidates receive the training they need.

Adjustments for Vulnerable Candidates:

The heatwave from March to May 2023 posed challenges during our selection process, particularly in remote areas. Many prospective trainees, primarily girls, expressed interest in the program but faced obstacles such as domestic responsibilities and distance from the training centre. To address these barriers, we initiated regular counselling and motivation sessions for both the candidates and their parents. Through persistent efforts, we successfully encouraged them to overcome their concerns and commit to the training.

Challenges and Successes:

Mobilizing 210 candidates within a short timeframe presented numerous challenges. However, our team of mobilizers, supported by operational staff and community cadres, successfully navigated these obstacles, leveraging existing goodwill in the region. Despite the challenges, we were able to achieve our mobilization targets effectively.

- Importance of flexibility and adaptability in project planning
- Need for effective communication and coordination among stakeholders
- Importance of targeted mobilization efforts based on local needs and conditions

INTRODUCTION

The National Youth Service Action and Social Development Research Institute (NYSASDRI) is a non-profit, non-governmental organization based in Odisha, India. Since its inception in 1973, NYSASDRI has been committed to the implementation of social justice and the development of marginalized sections of society. It operates in the most remote and inaccessible areas of Central Odisha, where the area is tribally dominated and more than 80% of the population reside below the poverty line. Its development initiatives cover more than 5.2 million underprivileged persons, including women, children, small farmers, rural artisans, the elderly, the disabled, and the destitute. NYSASDRI has developed an integrated strategy by combining direct service delivery with development support activities, such as research, advocacy and networking. With over 145 highly skilled professional personnel, NYSASDRI runs a number of programs. In remote areas- rural and tribal communities, it initiates sustainable socioeconomic development programmes, sets-up structures to ensure safe drinking water, provides sexual & reproductive health education as well as other non-formal education to girls, ensures basic health needs, organizes income generation through micro-credit, offers disaster management and mitigation, and restores eyesight of the elderly and children who are in need through its unit- Kalinga Eye Hospital & Research Centre (KEHRC). NYSASDRI School of Journalism and Social Work transcends every year 120 students become Professional Social Workers and Journalist. Skill based training like vision technician, diploma in optometrist by Kalinga Eye Hospital through NCVRT, Skill India and Singhania University. Different vocational training and skill based training courses like shorthand and typing, weaving, tie die batic and block printing, computer, tailoring,

cycle flower, readymade garment making etc are also organized to attain economic self sufficiency of women. In addition, NYSASDRI provides elderly care, support to people with disabilities, assistance for people with HIV/AIDS, malaria-prevention, local agricultural development, village infrastructure development and human rights promotion. Recently NYSASDRI completed a sewing machine skill based training for 350 unemployed women and ensured placement to all and this was done in association with Abbey West services.

Introduction and Background:

Abbey West Services was set up with a vision to provide world class skill development training programs with the support of Industry & Government to meet the demands of a fast-growing economy. Considering today's unemployment and lack of opportunities, we are focusing to contribute towards to education and skilling of students through a value system to help build a better world where people are self-sufficient as individual and play a constructive role in society.

Abbey West Services came into existence in the year 2010 at the temple city of BBSR by a group of passionate, highly qualified individuals to enhance the skills quotient of youth in India.

To ensure high quality Skill Development education and employment assurance which can create positive impact towards to society, AWSS has undertaken and successfully implemented various Central and State projects as stated below:

1. Counseling Camps-We organize counseling camps of our own or we attend counseling camps organized by Govt.in different blocks. Securing the best and getting sufficient result is not an easy task though yet we have developed our own mobilization camps where we are reaching out to most needy and deserving people

2.Door to door counseling-Our mobilisers reach each individual and counsel them. It is all about building relationships with whether it is individual or parents because we believe this is the wise and effective way to analyze their life and come up with a solution

3. Student Referral-Students also counsel and refer candidates which help in mobilization.

Training Delivery:

- Training is a set of a systematic processes designed to meet learning objectives related to trainees for their future jobs. These processes can be grouped into the following phases; needs analysis, design, development, implementation, and evaluation, firmly we believe there are three categories of learning things such as knowledge, skills, and attitude.
- Mostly we have used the method which allows the trainer and trainee to interact and practice behavior in a real fashion. Learning through experience and interaction are best at skill development and attitude changing Programme we often use business games, role plays, motivational speech are the best technique towards to changing behavior.
- Seminars are being arranged by the organization for better exposure and to remove stage fear from candidates.
- Guest lecturers are adding a value to the training process.
- Industrial visits are arranged to enable them to better identify their prospective areas of work in the overall organizational function.
- Using E-learning in our training Programme uplift our students to the growing world where we train them in digital literacy and other social site handle so that they can be occupied with more knowledge.

Assessments and Certifications:

Internal Assessments for the subjects are done in a month to know the inputs of the subjects taught to them. This was done to know how much they have grasped and how much effort has to be put in for their improvement.

After the assessment a proficiency certification are being arranged by the organization.

Placements and Post Placement tracking:

We focus on the placements of the candidates in other companies. We have more than 80 employers tied up which is growing in numbers, After completion of their class room training candidates are provided with practical experience of the above mentioned trades in various organizations. We have a strong tracking team consisting of 9 members those who are available for candidates on a day to day basis regarding their retention at their respective workplace. Whenever the candidates face any problems our tracking team handle their grievances in short span by discussing with the concerned officials of the respective employers. Regular visit of our placement and tracking team members to the work places of our Alumnae encourages them to continue their employment. We gather the feedback of our candidates such as about their employers, about their lodging and boarding, about their duties and responsibilities and also whether they are getting their remuneration in proper time or not through telephonic tracking and by physical verification of our placement tracking team as and when required
